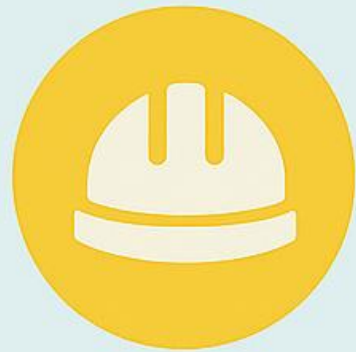

Stolen EBT Benefits? Here's What to Do

Step 1: Report Immediately

Call EBT Customer Service at 1-888-328-6399

- Report your card stolen
- Request a replacement card

Step 2: Apply for Reimbursement

If eligible, you can apply to get stolen benefits replaced:

- Residents of Other NY Counties: Submit in person, by mail, or through the NYDocSubmit app:

What is Skimming and Phishing?

- Skimming: Scammers attach devices to card readers to steal your card number and PIN.
- Phishing: Fake texts or emails pretending to be from the government, asking for your EBT info.

Tip:

- Change your EBT PIN regularly.
- Don't share your card info with anyone.
- Watch out for fake messages or suspicious card readers.

Food Assistance



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Access free or low-cost food programs available to New Yorkers. These services include food pantries, community meals, and government programs like SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program). No referral is required for most locations. You can also apply for food benefits or find local pantries by visiting Access HRA or calling 311.

Services may include:

- Emergency food pantries
- Free community kitchens and hot meals
- SNAP (Food Stamps) application support
- Grocery delivery for eligible seniors or homebound individuals

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Red Hook on the Road – Free Commercial Driving (CDL) Training in NYC

Red Hook on the Road helps unemployed New Yorkers who already have a Class D license begin careers in commercial driving. After completing four weeks of classroom and behind-the-wheel training, students take the NYS CDL (Class B/BPS) road test. Graduates are placed with a network of local employers, including opportunities to drive trucks, buses, and Access-A-Ride vehicles.

Note: This program does not provide training for Class A (long-distance) trucking licenses.

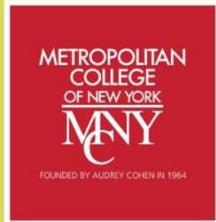

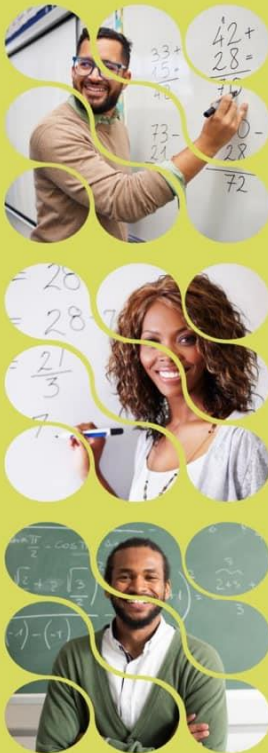

The NCLEX-RN Preparation for Foreign-Trained Nurses training program is delivered in partnership with the New York City Welcome Back Center at LaGuardia Community College and Lehman College. The program prepares individuals who worked as nurses in their home countries to pass the NYS Registered Nurse licensing exam, the National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN). Participants in this program will gain the English language and nursing skills they need to pass the exam and gain employment as Registered Nurses with hospitals and other employers. Graduates of the NCLEX-RN program make an average of \$100,000 annually.

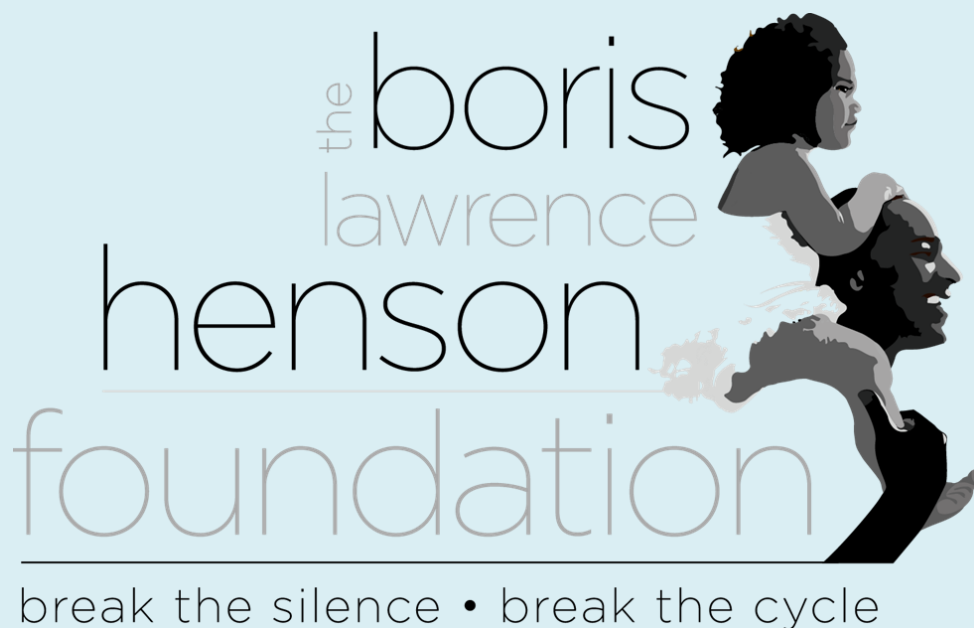

Overview

Vaccines

- Always wear a mask if you're sick and near others.
- Mask for 5 days after leaving isolation and 10 days after exposure.

Work with a Criminal Record



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Job applicants deserve to be judged based on their qualifications. The NYC Human Rights Law makes it illegal for most employers to inquire about criminal records before making a job offer. Job postings, applications, and interviews must not include questions about an applicant's criminal background.

Employers may only consider criminal history after a conditional offer is made and must show that the criminal record directly relates to the job or poses an unreasonable risk. They are legally required to share a written analysis, a copy of the background check, and provide the applicant with an opportunity to respond.

Certificates of Rehabilitation

Certificates of Rehabilitation help restore lost rights due to convictions. These documents create a legal presumption of rehabilitation and must be considered by employers during the hiring process. If granted, the certificate is noted on an individual's Record of Arrest and Prosecution (RAP Sheet).

There are two types:

1. Certificate of Relief from Civil Disabilities (CRCD)

- For individuals with one felony and any number of misdemeanors
- Available for federal, out-of-state, or foreign convictions
- A separate certificate is required for each conviction

2. Certificate of Good Conduct (CGC)

- For individuals with two or more felony convictions
- Covers all convictions with one certificate
- A waiting period applies:
 - 5 years for A, B, or C felonies
 - 3 years for D or E felonies
- Begins from date of release or last conviction (whichever is later)

Certificate of Relief

Eligibility: You may qualify if you have any number of misdemeanors and no more than one felony. Convictions in the same court on the same day are counted as one felony. This certificate can remove legal barriers to employment or licensing but does not guarantee approval.

Certificates may be issued upon release or during community supervision. Temporary certificates become permanent upon discharge. Note: Temporary certificates can be revoked by DOCCS.

Fair Chance Act & Article 23-A – Know Your Rights and Protections

“Criminal record? You can work with that.”

When qualifications come first, more New Yorkers gain employment — strengthening businesses and fueling our economy.

Overview

The Fair Chance Act (FCA) is a NYC law that strengthens protections for job applicants with criminal records. It requires most employers to delay criminal background checks until after a conditional offer of employment has been made.

Under Article 23-A of New York Correction Law, employers cannot deny employment solely due to a criminal record unless there's a direct relationship to the job or an unreasonable safety risk.

Key Protections for Job Seekers:

- Employers may not ask about arrests or convictions on job ads, applications, or interviews before making a conditional offer.
- After an offer, they may ask about convictions, but must consider your rehabilitation and job fit using 8 specific factors.
- You have 3 business days to respond if a job offer is revoked based on a background check.
- Employers must provide:
 - A copy of any background check or documents used
 - A written Article 23-A evaluation
 - A chance to respond before final decision

Important Notes:

- You are protected even if the background info comes from a third-party hiring service.
- Sealed or dismissed cases, juvenile adjudications, and petty offenses cannot be used against you.
- If you hold a Certificate of Relief from Disabilities or Certificate of Good Conduct, the law presumes you are rehabilitated.

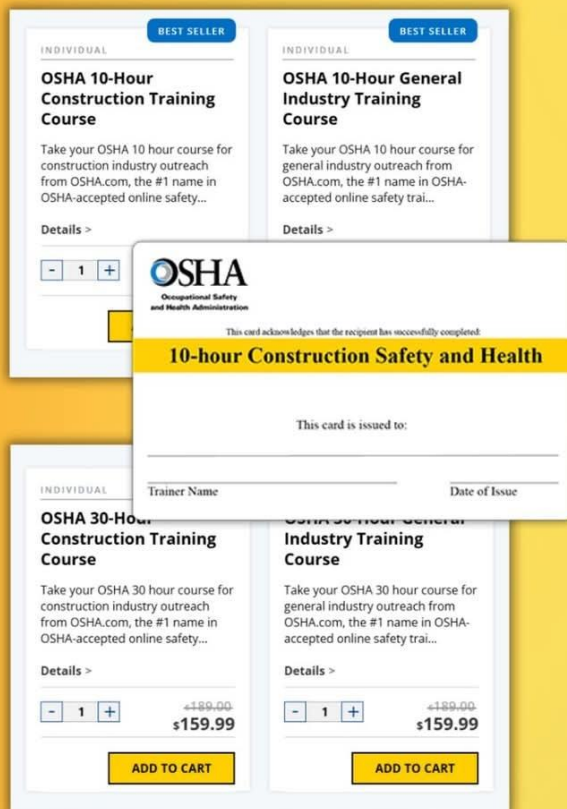

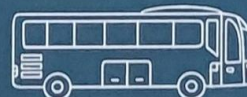

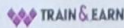
